Next week is anti-bullying week - this is a national campaign that we support every year. The theme this year is 'Make A Noise About Bullying.' We will be doing lots of work in school over the week on this idea and will be thinking about how we can do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes. To support this, we will have an anti-bullying performance from The B Tales Christian theatre group next Wednesday for all the KS2 junior classes. We will also be having an odd socks day on Wednesday 15.11.23 to support our anti-bullying activities. All the children are invited to come to school in odd socks - the brighter the better! The aim is to show how it is good to be different and how we should respect and celebrate those things that makes each of us unique. Our Y6 school council members will also be talking to the classes about bullying and carrying out a pupil safety survey to see how our children feel. They will publish their results in their termly school council newsletter.

In the classroom this week The children in our reception class have been invited to take part in the 'Me and My Family' competition. In this, the pupils are asked to draw either one of their family members or their whole family, and they can label their pictures too. The children are creating their master pieces in school and we will then send off all their entries. The competition panel will then choose their favourite pictures from all the entries that they receive to appear in a special Me and My Family Book Series. We look forward to seeing how creative our children can be and whether of their entries are published!
