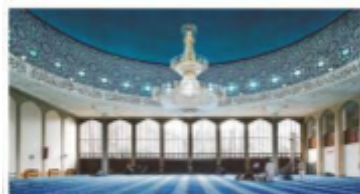

Key Ideas

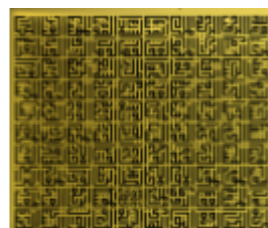
- The UK has more than 1750 mosques.
- There are great examples of Muslim architecture in the UK such as London Central Mosque and in places like Makkah (Great Mosque).
- There are fantastic examples of Christian architecture in the buildings of different cathedrals around the world, like St. Paul's Cathedral in London.
- Some architecturally beautiful buildings have been destroyed by natural disasters and war. It can cost millions to replace these buildings.
- In February 2011 an earthquake devastated the Christchurch Cathedral in Auckland, New Zealand. Its spire and the upper portion of the tower were destroyed and the earthquake severely damaged the rest of the building.
- In 2013 a transitional cathedral was built with rows of cardboard tubes to replace it.
- On 15 April 2019 a fire broke out beneath the roof of the Notre-Dame cathedral in Paris. By the time the structure fire was extinguished, the building's spire had collapsed, most of its roof had been destroyed, and its upper walls were severely damaged.
- Notre Dame raised over £868 million after its devastating fire through public donations, most of which was donated in first 72 hours.
- Notre-Dame Cathedral's restoration has so far cost over £751 Million.
- Christian Aid raised just over £86 million in the whole of last year (2021)
- In Islam, the concept of (Allah) God is that he is the Creator of all creations and nothing came before him. He is not human, man, creature or any other creation and so there is no physical image to draw him into. Therefore, Allah is never drawn in pictures.
- Muslims also aren't allowed to create images of people or animals because of the tendency to create these images and then worship them.
- However, there are many examples of beautiful Muslim artwork, such as works by Yasmin Kathrada and Ahmed Moustapha.
- In Christianity artwork has always been used to depict God, Jesus and parts of the Bible.
- Some of the most famous Christian paintings are 'The Last Supper' by Leonardo Da Vinci and 'The Transfiguration' by Raphael.



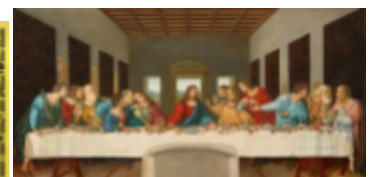

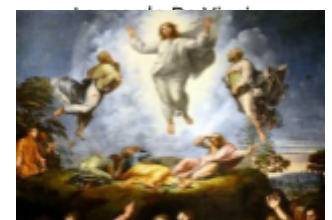
