We have had lots of hard work on the mid-term tests and SATS over this week across the school. We have been very impressed by how well all the children have approached them, and the resilience they have shown in tackling the questions. All we ask is that they do their best, and they have certainly done that! We would like to say a particular well done to the Y6 children who really have worked relentlessly in the build up to their SATS this week. We have been delighted by the effort that they have put into their tests. They should all be very proud of themselves. Now, they can look forward to some nice post SAT treats – they have earned it! The staff will use the results from the mid-term tests to help inform the end of year reports that they will soon be writing. These reports will be sent out to you on Friday 12th July. The final statutory assessments that we will carry out this year are the Y1 phonics check and the Y4 multiplication times-tables check. These will both take place following the Whit holiday.

In the classroom this week ...

On Monday, Little Barn Mobile Farm came back in to school to visit the children in EYFS again. This time they brought along Daffodil and Bluebell, two little lambs. The nursery and reception children had a lovely time. They gave the lambs a cuddle and fed them their morning milk. Meanwhile, our Y4 class having been working hard on practising for their multiplication tables check (MTC). They will be taking their actual MTC after the Whit holiday. The Y1 children have also been working very hard in the build up to their phonics check, which will also take place after the Whit holiday. We have been really pleased with how well all the children have been preparing for these checks – well done Y1 and Y4!
