#### Weekly Updates... Attendance Penalty Notices Update

We are sending out a letter from Salford Local Authority that outlines the changes that will be coming into place from September 2024 about Penalty Notices and the consequences that these will now carry. It is important that all parents and carers read this letter and understand the changes that will be happening.

#### Parent Meetings with the New Teachers for 2024/25

These meetings give the opportunity for parents and carers to meet with their child's new teacher, see their new classroom and find out about what they will be doing next year in their new class. Children can come to these events, but we ask that they stay with their parents/carers. The exception is the nursery meeting where new parents have been asked not to bring their children as it would be a very overwhelming situation inwhich to introduce the new children to the nursery classroom.

The KS1/2 meetings will start with an input from the class teacher followed by an informal session in which parents can ask any questions that they might have. The EYFS meetings will be run as an informal drop-in session in which parents can meet the new teacher, see the setting, collect information about next year and ask any questions that they might have.

All the sessions will run between 3.20 and 4.20pm. All the class meetings listed below are for the classes that the children will be in for the 2024/25 academic year – not their current class!

#### **Monday 15th July**

#### Wednesday 17th July

• Y1, Y2 & Reception meetings at 3.20pm - 4pm. The teacher input for the Y1 & Y2 meetings should finish by 4pm. There will then be an informal session from 4 - 4.20pm. During this, the Y1 & Y2 parents and carers can then stay (if they want to) to chat to the teacher on an informal basis. This also allows anyone who needs to visit the Reception class to do so before 4.20pm.

#### **Sports Days**

Our annual sports days will take place in the week beginning the 15<sup>th</sup> July:

- Monday 15<sup>th</sup> July: Y5/Y6 sports day from 9am.
- Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> July: Y3/Y4 sports day from 9am.
- Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July: Y1/Y2 sports day from 9am.
- Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> July: Y1/Y2 sports day from 9am.

The sports days will all be held on the school grounds on the area near God's Garden and the upper playground. Parents and carers are very welcome to come and watch their children take part. The sports days will start at 9am – so parents and carers are welcome to stay on after dropping off the children, if they want to. There will be chairs set out for spectators to sit on. The children should come to school in their PE kit on their sports day. If the weather is sunny (and hopefully it will be!) they should also bring a hat, water bottle and have sun-cream on.

However, given the summer we have had so far there is a chance that it could be raining! We will try our very best to make sure that the sports days go ahead as planned. We understand the problems that cancelling the sports day events can have and all the arrangements that people make to attend and support the children. For that reason, we will leave it until the morning of the sports day to decide whether or not it is going ahead. If it is raining too much, or the ground is too wet, then we will have no choice but to cancel the event. If an event is cancelled, we will try our best to rearrange it before the end of term.
