Our Y6 pupils all take on the role of senior pupil as they enter Y6. As our oldest pupils, we look to them to model our school values and expectations to the younger children. To reflect their role and responsibility, they wear a senior pupil badge. Over the course of the year, all the Y6 pupils also have the opportunity to take on the role of school counsellor. Again, this is a position of responsibility that sees them involved in discussing ways to improve our school with the senior leadership team, consulting on these ideas with the children and making decisions. They also report back to our school governors and help with our collective worship and other school events. They met with all the infant and junior classes this week to discuss what to buy with the money that we will collect for the school fund through our school fund non-uniform fundraising days. They will be writing a school council newsletter about this which will be sent out to you soon. We are really proud of them!

Weekly Updates... MacMillan Cancer Trust Non-Uniform Fund-Raising Day

Next Friday (27th September), we will be holding a non-uniform day to raise money for the MacMillan Cancer Trust. All the money that we raise will go to this good cause. We are asking for a contribution of £1 (payable via School Spider) and in return the children will be able to come to school in their own clothes. The Y5 children can come to school in their own sports clothes as they have PE in the afternoon.

Collective Worship Theme

The value that we will be looking in our collective worship this half-term is 'Courage. Each week the children look at different aspects of this value and what it means to them in their daily lives. In our weekly thoughtful book assembly, we share some of these ideas with the school. This week the children thought about what to do if they have a worry. They had some excellent ideas about who they could share any worries with and about the importance of having the courage to speak about them.

Courageous Advocates

As part of our collective worship programme, we look to give the children an opportunity each half-term to speak up about an issue that they feel passionate about. They can prepare what they want to say at home and then tell the rest of the school about it during our courageous advocates worship. They can do this either in a small group or by themselves. If any child wants to talk part they should speak to their class teacher or Mr Foster about it.
