It was also lovely to see the children getting behind our non-uniform day to raise money for the MacMillan Cancer Support today. We feel it is really important that the children get a sense of the role that they can play in supporting charitable activities. This is very much a part of our school's vision and outlook. We want to give our children a sense of aspiration, and hope that they can be a part of bringing about a change for the better in the communities in which thev including at times when circumstances are difficult. Our next charitable event will be the harvest collection which takes place next Wednesday. The children are all invited to bring in a harvest donation (tinned or packet nonperishable food) on the day to donate to The Salford Food Bank. We had fantastic support for this collection last year and we hope everyone can really get behind it again this year. More details about the harvest collection can be found later in this newsletter.

In the classroom this week Mr Houston explains that Year 5 have been reading Shackleton's Journey as the core text for their current reading unit. In science, they have been looking at properties of materials and have completed two investigations so far on soluble substances and flexibility of materials. In history, the children have been choosing the most influential and significant period of Ancient Greece. Whilst in geography, they have been looking at the location of countries relative to the equator in geography, and researching different biomes. Finally, Hundertwasser is the artist they have taken inspiration from in art and design. The children have used charcoal to complete subtractive drawing and we will be using paints in producing abstract art.

Weekly Updates... Y5 Bikeability Those members of our Y5 class who have chosen to will be taking part in the Bikeability programme over Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, next week. This will give them the chance to learn how to ride their bikes safely on the road. On the days that the children need to bring their bikes in, they should wheel them along the school pathway, through the gate by God's garden and lock their bike to the perimeter fence in the corner of the field.

Asda Cashpot For Schools

We would like to thank everyone who has already signed up to raise money for our school through this scheme. We have been amazed by the response we have already had, so far we have raised £205.98. All the money raised will be used to buy the play equipment that our school council has chosen as the focus of our fundraising work this year.

We are very pleased to be supporting the Salford Foodbank with our harvest collection again this year. Salford Foodbank is committed to ensuring that no-one goes hungry in Salford. As the city's primary crisis food bank, they are highly dependent on schools to help bolster their stocks at harvest. Therefore, we thought it would be a great idea for us to get behind this wonderful charity and give them our support at harvest time. Our school harvest collection will be on Wednesday 2nd October. We are asking that the children bring in tinned or packet non-perishable food. Staff from the Salford Foodbank will be coming into school to talk to the children about the work that they do and to take the donations away with them. Our Y6 class will also attend the morning service at All Saints Church on Wednesday 2nd October to talk to the congregation about harvest. The Y6 parents and carers are very welcome to attend the service, which will start at 10am.
