Weekly Updates... Five Ways to Wellbeing – Take Notice

The children will be welcomed back into school on Tuesday 29th October with a wellbeing day. The day will be dedicated to focusing on the theme "Take Notice," from the Five Ways to Wellbeing (see our dedicated website area for more details on this). This day is all about engaging in activities that encourage us to be present, appreciate our surroundings and genuinely enjoy the company of each other and our pupils.

Improved Attendance Awards

We were delighted to be able to give out improved attendance certificates to thirteen children in our assembly today. Each of them had shown an improvement in their attendance over the course of this half-term which is a fantastic achievement. We are hoping that we will be able to give out more improved attendance certificates at the end of next half-term.

Term Time Holidays

We have seen a marked rise in the number of children being taken out of school over recent weeks for term time holidays. The school's attendance policy clearly sets out that no absence for term time holidays will be authorised. This means that if children are missing school due to a term time holiday, it will be recorded as unauthorised absence.

New Legislation came into force on 19th August 2024 regarding the issuing of penalty notices relating to none school attendance. The following changes have come into force for penalty notice fines issued after 19th August 2024.

There is a single National Threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England and Wales of 10 sessions of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of any type of unauthorised absences.

Since 19th August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country are now £160, discounted to £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days. If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160 with no discount given for early repayment.

Any term time holidays that are taken after the start of the 2024/25 academic year will be treated under the new Legislation as the new rules apply to any offences committed from 19 August 2024, regardless of when the holiday is booked.

Should a third absence be taken within the three-year period, a parent may be summoned to the Magistrates Court for knowingly failing to secure good attendance at school (Section 444 (1A) of Education Act 1996).

Class Attendance Champions

Our whole school assembly this Wednesday was led by our class attendance champions. They fed back on the ideas that they had gathered from their classes about the ways they thought that our school could help support children improve their attendance. From all their wonderful ideas the following steps are going to be put into place:

- The class who wins Barney (our attendance mascot) the most times over a term will have a special treat day at the end of the term. This was a suggestion from Y5.
- Any class with a 100% attendance over a week will get an extra 10 minutes play time on Monday. This was a suggestion from Y5 and Y6.
- Make sure we are a welcoming school in which we are all nice to people so they want to come in -This was a suggestion from Y4 and Y6.
- An attendance trophy that is awarded at the end of each half-term to the class with the best attendance that half-term. This was a suggestion from Y3.
- A class spin to win on Friday afternoon with the names of all the children with 100% attendance for that week will win for a special prize. This was a suggestion from Y2 and Y6.

Well done to our attendance champions for helping to put these ideas into place.

Poppy Appeal

As we always do, this year we will continue to support the Poppy Appeal. From Wednesday 30th October we will be selling a range of poppy appeal items to support this wonderful cause. **Pupils will need to bring in cash to pay for these items.** Their class teacher will collect in any monies during registration time and send an order list through to our senior pupils who will sort the orders and deliver items back to classes later in the morning.
