This week, I have informed the school's governing board that I will be resigning from my post as headteacher at Wardley CE Primary School at the end of the coming spring term. Serving as headteacher of Wardley CE Primary School has been an extraordinary privilege. I would like to express my gratitude for all the support that I have received from the governors, staff, children and parents since taking on the role in September 2010. I am immensely proud of what we have achieved together in upholding the values that make Wardley CE Primary School such a special place. None of this would have been possible without the dedication and vision of everyone involved in our wonderful school community. However, for personal reasons, it is now the right time for me to step down from the role of headteacher and start my retirement. It has been an honour to serve this remarkable school, and I will always treasure the memories of my time here. I am now committed to working with the school's governing board and staff to ensure that all arrangements are made for a seamless transition as the school begins the next chapter of its story.

In the classroom this week History Workshops. The Year 6 class was visited by historian Richard White on Wednesday this week where they looked at artefacts from WWII. They were told information about the rise of The Third Reich and the invasion of Poland in 1939 and how this affected the people of Britain. They also looked at a wide range of propaganda posters and rationed food portions. The best part though was holding real shrapnel and an incendiary bomb! Later on, he visited the Year 4 class were they learned about the Anglo-Saxons and dressed up in clothes appropriate to the era. They also got to hold swords, shields and spears. It is safe to say that all of the children thoroughly enjoyed their session and we look forward to welcoming him back in the future.

Christmas Activities

Christmas is a very special and exciting time of the year in a primary school and as always, we will endeavour to make it a special time for all of our children here at Wardley.

Class Christmas Shows – In the week beginning Monday 09.12.24. Dates on the autumn term date list.

The classes are all going to be putting on their own special Christmas Shows for parents and carers to come and see. The children will be singing Christmas songs, reciting Christmas poems and sharing their Christmas thoughts. We really enjoyed the opportunity to do this in school last year and are very excited about giving you the chance to come into school again and share this special event with the children this year. The morning show will start at 9.00am and the afternoon services will start at 2.40pm. We have the space in the hall to safely accommodate two people per child to come and see each of the performances. We will not be giving out tickets but we do ask that you please respect the limits to the number of people that we can have coming to see the show. The children should come to school on the day of their Christmas show in festive Christmas party clothes — such as Christmas jumpers, sparkles or Christmas colours. We do not want any parents or carers feeling that they have to buy something special for this. Party clothes will be fine if they do not have any special Christmas items!

Christmas Jumper Day – Friday 13.12.24.

This is a non-uniform fundraising day for the Save The Children charity. If they want to, the children can come to school dressed in a Christmas jumper/festive party clothing.
