Reading  Rhythm Rain  Doud Herbough	<ul> <li>The Rhythm of the Rain by Grahame Baker-Smith puts meaning into how water is used and explores the global life cycle of water and weather. It also serves as a reminder that our actions and experiences are an important part of the bigger picture.</li> <li>Little People, Big Dreams - David Attenborough by Maria Isabel Sánchez Vegara is part of a series of books which explore the lives of extraordinary people. They all start with their life as a child with a dream who go on to achieve incredible things.</li> </ul>
Maths	<ul><li>Mass</li><li>Pictograms</li><li>Temperature</li><li>Word Problems</li></ul>
Art	<ul> <li>In art we will make prints using natural objects and learn how to make a collagraph printing block. Printing techniques are then combined to create repeated patterns, inspired by the work of William Morris.</li> </ul>
Science Uses of materials	<ul> <li>Chemistry - Materials</li> <li>In science we will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses</li> <li>We will also find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching</li> </ul>
Music	<ul> <li>Describing the pitch of a composition</li> <li>Copy back simple musical phrases, controlling pitch</li> </ul>

PE	<ul> <li>P.E. lessons will take place on Tuesday afternoons. Please ensure that you child has the correct kit for both indoor and outdoor use as weather permitting, the children will spend some of their lesson outside partaking in contact sports.</li> </ul>

Geography	<ul> <li>Throughout this topic we will look at geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of London, UK and Nairobi, Kenya.</li> </ul>
History	<ul> <li>In History we will be looking at significant historical events, people and places in Salford. We will focus primarily on Salford Waterways, including Bridgewater Canal, Salford Quays and Media City (Salford Docks).</li> </ul>
