The school's governing board, with the support of the Local Authority and Diocese, have been working on the arrangements for appointing my successor. The post has now been advertised and they are aiming to have a new headteacher in place for September 2025. This means that Mrs Walker, our deputy headteacher, will be taking on the position of acting headteacher over the coming summer term. In order for her to fully focus on the role she will be released from her Y6 teaching role. The Y6 class will be taught by Mr D Foster and a newly appointed Y6 teacher (details to follow, when this appointment has been confirmed). Mrs Walker will continue to oversee the Y6 class during the summer term and will be there for them during the build up to SATS and in the test week itself. She has the full backing of the governing board and the staff team and I am sure that she will be hugely successful in her new role.
